SUBJECT: Guardian Signatures

PURPOSE: To provide guidance in adhering to State instruction letter 11-01

BACKGROUND: The previous policy on the definition of guardian places undue hardship on youth applicants who require a parent or legal guardian signature. The state recognizes that persons other than the parent or legal guardian support many WIA eligible youth. In an effort to make eligibility more efficient for this population, the State has revised the definition of guardian as it relates to the WIA application.


POLICY: The following definition and documentation should be used when determining guardianship as it relates to a parent/guardian signature for youth eligibility.

A **Parent/Guardian** Signature is required for applicants under the age of 18. The term "guardian" for a WIA Youth application refers to any adult (at least 18 years of age or older) who is providing housing and financial support to the youth, regardless of legal status.

PROCEDURES:

In order to remain in compliance with WIA regulations, a Guardian Form for local WIA use is attached. The form must be completed by the adult guardian at the time of application and maintained in the applicant's case file.

NOTE: The definition of guardian authorized to sign the WIA application differs from the definition of guardian as it relates to family size. According to the WIA definition of family, a guardian's income should not be included in the family income unless documentation of legal guardianship or adoption can be provided.

STATE WIA INSTRUCTION NUMBER: 11-01

TO: Local Workforce Investment Area Administrators

SUBJECT: Guardian Signatures

ISSUANCE DATE: July 11, 2011

EFFECTIVE DATE: Immediately

PURPOSE: This State Instruction redefines the guardian signature required for Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Youth applications.

BACKGROUND: The previous policy on the definition of guardian places undue hardship on youth applicants who require a parent or legal guardian signature. The State recognizes that many WIA eligible youth are supported by persons other than the parent or legal guardian. In an effort to make eligibility more efficient for this population, the State has revised the definition of guardian as it relates to the WIA application.


POLICY: The following definition and documentation should be used when determining guardianship as it relates to a parent/guardian signature for youth eligibility.

A **Parent/Guardian Signature** is required for applicants under the age of 18. The term "guardian," for a WIA Youth application, refers to any adult (at least 18 years of age or older) who is providing housing and financial support to the youth, regardless of legal status. In order to remain in compliance with WIA regulations, a Guardianship Form for local WIA use is attached. The form must be completed by the adult guardian at the time of application and maintained in the applicant's case file.
