SUBJECT: Priority of Services Policy

PURPOSE:

To establish the priority of services for adults who are eligible for the WIA program in the Trident Workforce area.

POLICY:

The Workforce Investment Act provides that in the event funds allocated to a local area for adult self-sufficient employment and training activities are limited, priority shall be given to recipients of public assistance and other low-income individuals for intensive and training services.

PROCEDURES:


In the event funds are limited, the Trident Workforce Investment Board has established priority for intensive and training services will be given to adults in the following order:

1. Recipients of public assistance;
2. Low income Individuals as defined in Public Law 105-220, Title I, Subtitle A, section 101 (25). Low income means an individual who is unable to obtain or retain employment that allows for self-sufficiency.

TABE scores can be affected by the Priority of Services Policy as follows:

When the Priority of Services Policy is in effect, the scores for both reading and math may be adjusted as necessary.

The Trident Workforce Investment Board can suspend the Priority of Services Policy, as necessary.
